## HEBARD APPOINTED AS DISTRICT CHIEF

Fire Captain Stood First on Civil Service List

Entered Department in 1891— Badly Hurt at Blaze in 1910

Mayor Curley yesterday appointed Capt Harry M. Hebard of Engine 45 to be a district chief, to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Dist Chief Caine.

The appointment was made on the recommendation of Commissioner Glynn. Dist Chief Hebard stood first on the Civil Service list.

Dist Chief Hebard was appointed to the department July 16, 1891. He was made a lieutenant June 29, 1963. He was appointed captain July 14, 1911, and sent to Engine 29. He is regarded as a fearless firefighter.

He was seriously hurt at a fire in the lumber district in 1910 when a roof colapsed. He has served at many stations in the city and outlying sections. He has recently been stationed in Roslindal.
