






# PRESENTATION OF MEDALS

The Board of Merit has brought to the attention of the Fire Commissioner the following outstanding cases in which members of this department have especially distinguished themselves for valor in the performance of their duty.

The Commissioner, therefore, makes the following awards:

# "John E. Fitzgerald Medal" LADDERMAN WILLIAM W. AUSTIN of Ladder Co. 26

At approximately 11:30 A.M., Saturday, September 4, 1948, Ladderman William W. Austin of Ladder Co. 26, while off duty, and walking along the Charles River bank in Brighton, at a point opposite Brook Street, was startled to hear a young girl cry out, "Mister, Mister, hurry, hurry, or she will drown." Ladderman Austin ran to a boatlanding nearby on which several small children were excitedly screaming. He was shocked to see a small girl struggling in the water about ten feet from the boatlanding. Ladderman Austin immediately jumped into the river, lunged forward, grasped the little girl, and struggled back to the pier. The water at this point is about ten to twelve feet deep and Ladderman Austin cannot swim.

This was a most beginning the same and th

This was a most heroic act, reflecting great credit upon the Boston Fire Department. Ladderman Austin, although unable to swim, jumped into the river, with complete disregard for his own life, and saved this little girl from drowning. He was commended by the Fire Commissioner in General Orders No. 53, series of 1948.

The Board of Merit, consisting of the Chief of Department, and the Deputy Chiefs, is pleased to recommend that Ladderman William W. Austin be awarded the "John E. Fitzgerald Medal."

# "Walter Scott Medal"

# HOSEMAN EDWARD A. CODAIR of Engine Co. 22

At 12:53 P.M., March 23, 1948, the department responded to an alarm from Box 1324, three alarms, for a fire in the Crawford House, 17-19 Scollay Square, Boston. Hoseman Codair was acting as Aide to the Deputy Chief and was instructed by the Deputy to enter the building in order to ascertain the extent of the fire. During his investigation, on the fourth floor, while opening windows for the purpose of ventilation, he saw the body of an unconscious man slumped on the floor between a bed and the window. The room was heavily charged with smoke. He immediately reached down, and with great effort, placed this unconscious man on his back, and proceeded from the room to the hallway and down the stairs to the street. Hoseman Codair encountered considerable smoke, gases, and heat, but tenaciously held the unconscious man on his back, and made his way to the street. He distinguished himself with valor in rescuing this man, thereby, reflecting great credit upon the Boston Fire Department. He undoubtedly saved the victim's life and was highly commended in General Orders No. 26, series of 1948, by the Fire Commissioner.

The Board of Merit, consisting of the Chief of Department, and the Deputy Chiefs, is pleased to recommend the awarding of the "Walter Scott Medal" to Hoseman Edward A. Codair of Engine Co. 22.

Portable Oil Burner?

If you use a portable oil burner for space heating, you have in your home a lethal weapon. For many weeks past every edition of our daily papers has told of tragedy, suffering, and destruction in hundreds of homes throughout this section of the country. The cause? Portable space heaters in most instances.

With care in the use and handling of such heaters, they can be fairly safe, but they are still lethal weapons! For your own safety, the safety of your loved ones, and the safety of your neighbors, won't you please observe these simple rules?

1. Extinguish the flame before you refill the bowl.

2. Do not fill it to full capacity.

3. Never move it from place to place while it is burning.

4. Be sure it is a safe distance from combustible material.

5. Keep it clean.

6. Never place it in the normal paths of travel from room to room.

7. Have no "horse play" where one is in operation.

8. Never forget that fuel oil is a very inflammable liquid.

9. Remember that to be safe you must be CAREFUL!
