At a Meeting of the Freeholders and other Inhabitants of the Town of Boston legally qualified and warned in Publick Town Meeting Assembled at Faneuil Hall on Monday the 14th. Day of March Anno Domini 1763 —

The Town brought in their Votes for Twelve Firewards, and upon sorting them it appeared that

Voted, That Application be made to the General Court by our Representatives, for liberty to choose four Fire-Wards, in addition to the number allowed by Law —

That Clause in the Warrant, Viz^t. “ Whether the Town will improve the Indulgence of the General Court, which by a [557.] Late Law permits them to Elect and Appoint, Four meet Persons as Fire-Wards, in addition to the present number of twelve “ &c.” being Read, it was Voted, that the Consideration thereof be referred over to the next March Meeting. —
