

## BOSTON TOWN RECORDS, 1765.

[613.] At a Meeting of the Freeholders and other Inhabitants of the Town of Boston legally qualified and warned in publick Town Meeting Assembled at Faneuil Hall on Monday the 11<sup>th</sup> Day of March Anno Domini. 1765 —
