MANY SHIFTS IN FIRE DEPARTMENT

Two New Houses Organized and Two Disbanded

Ten Transfers of Officers Will Take Place Friday

Two new fire houses are to be established, two disbanded and several superior officers of the department transferred, according to general orders issued yesterday by Chief Peter F. McDonough.

Engine Company 49 will be placed in new quarters established at Milton and Hamilton sts, Readville. The apparatus will, temporaily, consist of a combination hose and chemical wagon. Engine Company 50 will go to the remodeled quarters of Chemical Company 3, Winthrop st, Charlestown. Here a tractor engine and combination hose and chemical wagon will be installed. Headquarters of District 2 will be located here, instead of at Ladder 9, as heretofore.

On Friday, Hose 49, Sprague st, Readville, will be disbanded, as will Chemical 9. Main st, Charlestown. One promotion is announced, that of Lieut William C. Swan of Ladder 17, to be a captain. These transfers take effect Friday: Capt J. F. Gillen, from Engine 9 to Ladder 2; Capt T. J. Flynn, from Engine 33-33 to Engine 9; Capt W. C. Swan. from Ladder 17 to Engine 33-33; Capt P. A. Tague, from Engine 34 to Engine 50; Lieut J. J. Burke, from Engine 15 to Engine 49; Lieut E. J. Hartigan, from Engine 23-35 to Engine 15; Lieut E. J. Locke, from Engine 26-35. Lieut T. F. Quigley, from Ladder 9 to Engine 36 to Leut T. J. Heffron. from Chemical 9 to Ladder 9; Lieut W. F. Heldt, from Engine 35 to Engine 56
