Brave Deeds in the Saving of Life Honored.

Fire Commissioner Russell has just announced the reward of silver medals and certificates to eight men in the department for brave service while in the discharge of their duty. The commissioner had submitted their names

The men honored are Capt J J. O'Connor of engine 7, East st; Lieut J J. McMithon of combination 8, ladden and the control of combination 8, ladden and D. Dilscoll of the same company 12, Florence Donaghue of combination 8, hoseman M. A. Kenneally of engine 7, hoseman D. Dilscoll of the same company, Thomas J Muldoon of chemical 8, South Boston, and W. H. Magner of ladder 8, Fort I fill sq.
The tire where Capt O'Connor and Kenncally and Driscoll distinguished themselves occurred early on the morning of Feb 5 in the building at the corner of Devonshire and State sts. They researed a woman under most perilous circumstances.
Lears and Donaghue, together with a law strdent. George R. Dean, saved the lives of three persons on Auburn st. West End, in the early evening of Jan 29 last.
Lieut McMahon is known as one of the bravest men in the department, and time and again has performed meritorious duty. He was formerly attached as whon appointed from the ranks only a short time ago was sent to combination. Thomas J. Muldoon of chemical 8 performed a daring deed one hight last February in bringing an arged women from the third floor of the dwelling house 62 fold st. Her clothing was on free and she had been overcome Muldoon carried her to the street, her letters still burning. She died within a few hours at the city hospital.
