To His Honor the Mayor and the City Council of the City of Boston:—

Gentlemen, — In compliance with the provisions of the City Ordinance, the Board of Fire Commissioners herewith presents its Twelfth Annual Report, containing a statement of the fires and their causes, the condition of the department, and expenditures for the year ending April 30, 1885.

Organization.

The organization of the department consists of a Board of three Commissioners, a Chief Engineer, a Superintendent of Fire-Alarms, 13 Engineers, and officers and other members, including telegraph operators, to the number of 686 men. Important changes in the organization of the force have taken place during the year. Engine Companies 1, 9, 12, 13, and 27 were reorganized in September as permanent companies, of 9 men each, and permanent captains were substituted for call in Engine Companies 2, 5, 11, 18, 20; Ladder Companies 2, 4, 5, 9, 12. In October Chief Engineer William A. Green assumed the duties of Fire Commissioner, and was succeeded by Lewis P. Webber, Assistant Engineer of District 8. Foreman Edwin H. Sawyer, of Ladder Co. 12, being commissioned, November 1, his successor.

A new Hayes Extension Ladder was placed in service in quarters Fort Hill Square, under charge of Ladder Co. 8, and with the exception of District 3 the several Assistant Engineers have been supplied with a horse and wagon.

The department as now organized is as follows:—

BOARD OF FIRE COMMISSIONERS

Consists of three members. One member is appointed annually, in April, for a term of three years from the first Monday in May following. The nomination is made by the Mayor, subject to confirmation by the City Council.

John E. Fitzgerald, for three years from May, 1885. Term expires May, 1888.

WILLIAM A. GREEN, for three years from May, 1884. Term expires May, 1887.

FIRE DISTRICTS.

The city is divided into Ten Fire Districts, as follows:—

District 1. — Comprises all that part of Boston known as East Boston.

District 2. — All that part of Boston formerly known as Charlestown.

District 3.— All that part east of a line beginning at the Charles-river drawbridge, and running through the centre of Charlestown street, Haymarket square, and Washington to Summer street, and north of Summer street and the N.Y. and N.E. R.R. passenger depot to the water.

DISTRICT 4. — All that part west of District 3, and north of a line running through the centre of Winter and Park streets, and west of Beacon, to Arlington street, west side of Commonwealth avenue, to Chester park, to water.

- DISTRICT 5. All that part south of Districts 3 and 4 to the centre of Dover-street drawbridge, and a line running through the centre of Dover, Berkeley, Boylston, east side of Commonwealth avenue, to Arlington, to Boylston street.
- DISTRICT 6. All that part of Boston known as South Boston.
- DISTRICT 7. All that part of Boston south of District 5, to the centre of Albany street; thence through the centre of Albany, Northampton street, Columbus avenue, and Chester park, to east side of Commonwealth avenue, to centre of Berkeley, to Dover street.

- DISTRICT 8. All that part south and west of District 7, to the boundary line of West Roxbury, and west of Washington street to the Brookline boundary line, and including all of Ward 25, formerly Brighton.
- DISTRICT 9. All that part south of Districts 6 and 7, to
 West Roxbury line, running through the
 centre of Blue-Hill avenue, Columbia,
 Green, Bowdoin, Church, and Commercial
 streets, to Dorchester avenue, thence due
 east to the water.
- District 10. All the southerly part of Boston south of Districts 8 and 9, including West Roxbury.

Houses.

The houses of the department are in good condition, and all are fitted up and furnished with a view to the counfort of men and horses and the ready response to alarms. Much expense is saved the city and good work accomplished by the detail of members to do the inside repairs. Extensive alter-

ations have been made in Engine-houses 1, 9, 13, 27, occa-

sioned by these companies being made permanent.

A new house, for the accommodation of Ladder Co. 9 and Hose Co. 1, has been erected on Main street, Charlestown, and is being completed in accordance with plans approved by this Board.

The proposed engine and ladder house to be located at the corner of Boylston and Hereford streets has not been commenced, although plans are being made under direction of

the city architect.

A lot of land has been purchased by the city, upon which an engine-house is to be built on Saratoga street, East Boston. Plans for the same are being prepared for approval by this Board.

An appropriation of \$24,000 has been made by the City Council for the purchase of land and erection of a new house

for Hose Co. 4, in the Charlestown District.

During the year a new building has been erected at the corner of Albany and Bristol streets for a repair-shop. The building is built of brick, and gives accommodation for all the work to be done on apparatus, hose, and harness, and affords room for storage of supplies, etc. A large yard and building adjoining on Bristol street give additional storage-room for lumber, etc. The building, although erected, has not been completed for occupancy, but will be so in a few weeks, giving to the department one of the best equipped fire department repair-shops in the country.

General repairs have been made on Engines 9, 14, 16, 21, 28, and 31, Relief Engines F, and the Mystic, Ladder Truck 5, Chemical Engine A, and the coal-wagon of Engine 20, Engines 14, 21, and the Mystic receiving new boilers. Extensive repairs were made on Engines 14, 17, 19, 25, 26, and 32, Ladder Truck 8, Chemical Engines 2 and 5, and wagons of the Chief Engineer and Hospital Surgeon, and a large amount of work done for hanging harnesses and fire-alarm telegraph.

Horses.

The number of horses in the department April 30, 1885, was 168. During the four winter months extra horses were placed in service under agreement with the owners that such service should be without cost to the city other than the care and feed, the same as is given the regular horses of the department. The horses have been free from any epidemic, and have received inspection from the Hospital Surgeon, who has made weekly reports to the Board of their condition and treatment, both in quarters or at the Hospital.

WATER AND HYDRANTS.

The total number of hydrants in the city, May 1, was 4,793. In addition to these hydrants there are 238 fire reservoirs in different sections of the city, that contain from 300 to 500 hogsheads of water, and can be used in an emer-

gency. The number of hydrants added during the year is as follows:—

29 Lowry, 55 Post, 28 Boston, and 67 Boston Lowry. The amount paid by this department for water and the care and maintenance of hydrants was \$90,640, or at the rate of \$20 per hydrant.

In all cases the Water Board have cheerfully complied with the requests of this Board in the establishment of

hydrants whenever necessity required.

FIRE-ALARM DEPARTMENT.

The new construction and repair work done by this department within the year ending April 30 is as follows:—

No. 2 circuit, covering the South End and Back Bay, was completely rebuilt last summer and equipped with new fixtures and material throughout its entire route. It was divided into two circuits, numbered 2 and 17, with the boxes and other apparatus alternating in their connections so far as was practicable for the purpose of affording greater protection and safety to the service.

A third circuit — No. 18 — was projected early in the year, and is now nearly completed, running through and covering a part of the city now protected by circuits 3 and 5. The same plan of alternation in the connection of signal-boxes into this circuit will be followed as was employed in the new

South-End work.

The four independent gong circuits, connecting the department houses in the city proper with head-quarters, have been completed, and are giving the most satisfactory results.

Telephone service has been extended to the house of the foreman of construction, Chemical Engine 5, and the new apparatus repair shop, making 58 stations connected with the Fire Department.

New seven wired 350-feet cables have been laid at the

bridges on Dover and Federal streets.

The bell has been removed from the old repair-shop and placed on the house of Engine 30. Three bells have been discontinued during the year.

Eleven new fire-alarm boxes have been put up, and twentyone new keyless doors substituted for the old style since the

last report.

Early in the spring of last year a new clock was placed on Lyceum Hall, in East Boston. It was illuminated by gas until December, but at that time arrangements were made with the Union Electric Light Company for electric illumination, which has continued to give good satisfaction. Extensive changes and improvements have been made at head-quarters in the arrangement of the wires. A room has been assigned and prepared for a head-house, and here the wires are so placed that the use of any one of them may be determined at sight, which greatly facilitates the testing of the inside connections. An elaborate system of lightning-arresters has been so arranged that any part of it can be readily examined or used for testing purposes.

Some additional improvements have been introduced in the operating-room. The new counter has been completed, and it fully justifies the expectations raised by the previous

work of Mr. Heyman.

Experiments are now being made with an automatic testing apparatus, introduced by the Electrical Development and Manufacturing Company. It is a novel and ingenious instrument, designed to test each circuit for ground escapes once in every hour of the day and night. Its action is entirely automatic, and it has thus far worked with perfect success.

During the year there were 927 alarms, this being 134 in excess of the previous year, which was the largest for any year since the establishment of the city. The months of June, 1884, January and March, 1885, proved the most disastrous for losses, although in December and April there were the greatest number of alarms, 48 out of 114 in April being calls on the department to extinguish fires in brush grass, etc., which in many instances were needless. Statistics show that throughout the country there have been many disastrous fires during the year, and frequently accompanied by loss of life. Happily, this city has been free from the latter calamity; but, in the opinion of this Board, such disasters are liable to occur here unless stringent measures are resorted to for carrying out the provisions of Chap. 251, Acts of 1883, in relation to securing better provision for escape from hotels, boarding and lodging houses, factories, workshops, and similar establishments in case of fire.

For the first time since the reorganization of the department in 1873 the commissioners have the sad duty of recording the death of two of its members. On the morning of August 13, Hoseman Joseph Pierce and Permanent Substitute James Quigley, both of Engine Co. 4, while on the roof of the burning building 108 to 112 Beach street, were precipitated by the falling in of same into the flames. They died at their post of duty as became brave firemen.

At the fire 43 India square, March 8, James W. Sweetser, a member of the Protective Department, was killed by the falling of a ladder.

In accordance with the provisions of Chap. 107 of the Acts of 1880 in relation to pensioning firemen, the following pensions have been granted, viz.:—

Mrs. Emma A. Pierce, widow of Hoseman Joseph Pierce, of Engine 4, killed in service August 13, 1884, the sum of three hundred dollars per annum, as an annuity, to be paid in monthly instalments of \$25 each, dating from Aug. 16, 1884.

Orestes L. Wood, of Engine Co. 15, permanently injured at fire Feb. 27, 1873, at the rate of \$1.50 per day, dating from Nov. 16, 1885.

Thomas F. Killion, of Ladder Co. 12, permanently injured at fire June 17, 1882, at the rate of \$1.50 per day, dating

from Nov. 16, 1884.

Horatio Ely, of Hose Co. 8, being by reason of old age and disability unable to perform his duties as an active fireman, and his having served more than fifteen years in the department, the sum of \$1 per day from March 16, 1885.

POLICE.

The Board of Fire Commissioners appreciates the efficiency of the police in preserving order at fires, and keeping the streets clear for the better operation of this department, and acknowledges their vigilance and promptness in discovering and giving alarms for fire; 194 having been given by the police during the past year.

PROTECTIVE DEPARTMENT.

The efficiency of the Protective Department, and continued harmony between its members and that of the Fire Department at fires, are appreciated by those in charge.

THE FIREMEN'S RELIEF FUND.

The trustees of this fund, in their report for the year ending Dec. 31, 1884, submitted a statement showing the receipts for the year, including \$306.36 cash on hand, to be \$16,420.40, of which \$13,146.25 were the net proceeds of the

ball given in its aid. Of the disbursements \$7,462.25 were on account of relief, \$600 of which were for funeral expenses of deceased members. \$8,000 was invested in a City of Boston Bond.

The amount of money invested April 30, 1885, was \$48,000.

A constant watch is kept at the head-quarters, City Hall, night and day, by the operators. Each operator has assigned to him certain hours of duty, during which time he is responsible for the correct working of the apparatus in giving alarms, and all testing of the circuits and other details pertaining to the service. An automatic arrangement is connected with the receiving apparatus, by which assistance may be called from the sleeping apartments, if at any time the operator should be suddenly incapacitated by illness from performing his duties. No operator is permitted to sleep during his watch, unless expressly relieved by some one else, and by consent of the Superintendent.

Each operator is accountable to the Superintendent for any mistakes that may occur at the office during his hours of duty. An accurate account is kept of the time of giving each alarm, and of the station from which it originates, and all other necessary information.
