

Office of the Board of Fire Commissioners, 74 Tremont Street, Boston, Feb. 1, 1892.

HON. NATHAN MATTHEWS, JR., Mayor of the City of Boston:

SIR: The Fire Commissioners respectfully submit the nineteenth annual report of this department since its reorganization, including, in this instance, a statement of its operations for thirteen months, ending January 31, and showing its condition upon that date, with certain recommendations looking to its steady improvement in the future.

ALARMS AND LOSSES.

During the thirteen months ending January 31, 1892, there were 1,230 bell and still alarms, besides 24 second and 7 third alarms. This is a considerable increase over any previous period of equal duration. Of these alarms, 162 were needless and 12 were false. The fire loss amounts to about a million and a half dollars, a large amount considered by itself, but not excessive when the character of the fires and the value of the property at stake are considered.

GROWTH OF THE DEPARTMENT.

The strength of the department has been increased during the year as far as the resources at its disposal would permit. Since the last report was issued a double engine-company has been put in commission on Congress street, and has added materially to the protection of a section where property of great extent and value is at stake. A new house in East Boston for the accommodation of an engine company and a ladder company has been completed and occupied. The house of Hose 6 has been altered for the reception of Chemical Engine 7, bringing that important piece of apparatus nearer the centre of the district, and thus more promptly available for the great majority of fires occurring there than it was before. Thus East Boston is stronger by the addition of a permanent engine-company and a better disposition of her forces. A new aërial ladder-truck and company have been located in the house built for this purpose on Harrison avenue, near Harvard street. A new engine-house has been

completed and accepted at Allston, and a company will be organized and equipped for service at that point in a few weeks. Another engine-house is practically ready at Egleston square, though not yet accepted. At Washington Village, a house to accomodate a steam fire-engine and eventually a ladder truck is in process of construction and will probably be finished in the early summer. After encountering many discouragements the Commissioners have at last succeeded in finding and purchasing a site for a ladder house on Washington street opposite the Consumptives' Home at Grove Hall. The location seems in all respects satisfactory, and building will commence as soon as the money is appropriated. The same is true of the chemical engine-house site at Ashmont. Requests have been made for the location of more apparatus in various portions of Dorchester, Roxbury, and West Roxbury, and several of them are grounded in reason; but there ought to be some immediate prospect of building upon what we have before recommending the purchase of more land to lie idle.

The Commissioners are happy to announce that with respect to the long-delayed department headquarters, they have reached a stage of comparative definiteness. A site has been secured on Bristol street, adjoining the yard of the department repair-shop. The City Architect and the Commissioners have had frequent and careful consultations, and the former has produced a set of plans which promise to satisfactorily meet the requirements which have so often been given publicity by this Board. While the site selected is neither the first nor second choice of the Commissioners, it is the best, all things considered, that they were able to obtain; and when the building is completed and equipped with a new and improved fire-alarm system, it will be found a highly valuable addition to the department.

One of the most pressing needs of the service is a commodious, light, warm, and well-ventilated stable where can be kept and cared for, spare horses, or horses that need rest on account of overwork, or treatment because of injuries, lameness, etc. The money for the building has already been arranged for, and it was proposed to erect it upon land owned by the city on Boston street, adjoining Engine-house 21, but public sentiment was so opposed to that location that it had to be abandoned. A recommendation is now before the City Council that the site of the old bath-house on Cabot street be used for this purpose. It is desirable that the matter should soon be settled, as at present the department has to hire quarters for this branch of its business. One of the leading features in the general scheme for increasing the strength of the department which was adopted a couple of years ago was the establishment of a doubleengine company at the North End, as near as possible to the centre of the circle made by the various pieces of apparatus now located in the business section of the city proper. The Commissioners have searched diligently to find a proper site for such a house, but thus far their efforts have been barren of results. This fact they greatly regret, for all the time the need of this increased protection is growing more imperative.

NEW APPARATUS.

The interests of the department demand that a certain amount of new apparatus should be purchased each year, not merely to equip new companies, but to meet the wear and tear that is as much a factor here as in any other kind of business where machinery is extensively employed. During the past year five new Clapp & Jones steam-engines of third size have been bought, each with a capacity of over 600 gallons per minute. Several of these have been located in Dorchester and West Roxbury, replacing the old and much-worn apparatus there with as good machinery as any part of this or any other city can show. Another piece of apparatus which gives hopeful promise of being an important adjunct to the system is a combination chemical-engine and hosewagon, recently received from the manufacturer, Mr. Charles T. Holloway, of Baltimore, and located at Roslindale. Another has been ordered and is in process of construction. This combination seems to promise most excellent results in the dwelling-house portions of the city where the water pressure is sufficient to give a fair hydrant-stream. The Commissioners have now equipped three engines and five ladder-trucks with three-horse hitches, and during the year they hope to still further extend the use of these valuable devices.

WATER SUPPLY.

While for the most part Boston is provided with a water service ample for almost any possible demand upon it, in some sections building has been so extensive and sporadic as to make the provision to meet it insufficient. The Fire Commissioners and the Water Commissioners have had frequent and friendly conferences concerning this matter, and the latter have shown a disposition to cordially cooperate with this board and carry out to the extent of their power the improvements which the experiences of this department show to be necessary. We are indebted to the Water Board for valuable sets of plans and maps, showing where the strength or weakness of the service lies, and how much apparatus can be effectively worked at a given point. Not only is the work of laying more and larger mains to be pushed as fast as possible, but steps have also been taken toward the introduction of a new and improved hydrantservice, and when the contemplated work is completed, Boston will be as well equipped in this respect as almost any city in the land.

INSPECTION OF WIRES.

Within the year the city ordinances have been so changed as not only to restore to this department one of its most vital features, the fire-alarm telegraph, but also to place under its charge the whole duty and responsibility of the inspection of A report of this branch of the service is given elsewires. While the work of this bureau is unquestionably a where. benefit to the city, the value of the service might be greatly increased if it was invested with more authority; and to this end additional legislation is recommended. Immediate improvements in the fire-alarm system are in progress or in contemplation, and when the new plant on Bristol street shall be established, it will be the aim of the Commissioners to see that it is as complete in all valuable devices for quick and effective work as modern invention can make it.

PERSONNEL OF THE DEPARTMENT.

The composition of the force in all its branches includes 762 men, of whom 156 are call members. In addition there are 40 pensioners on the pay-roll of the department, and more will be added this year. The new companies to go into service will also call for an enlargement of the working-force. We are sorry to be again obliged to declare the provincial feature of a great city like Boston, by announcing that the department is still partly on a call basis; and the Commissioners desire to once more go on record, as they have for the past five years, in favor of a speedy termination of this mixed condition of things. The call men, as a class, are individually excellent, but the system is a damage and a reproach, a relic of antiquity that is now very much out of place. Good work has been done at the drill school in its various branches the past year, and special provisions will be made at the new headquarters to give this important feature increased value.

Horses.

There are now in service in the department 273 horses, of which number the city owns 218, the others being extras for winter use, loaned by various parties for the consideration for their proper care and keeping. The condition of these animals has been for the most part excellent, the department veterinary recently reporting that of this large number there was not one unable to perform his duty. During the year 43 horses were purchased and 5 received from the Inspector of Wires, 23 were sold or exchanged, and 2 died from disease. The number of horses receiving treatment during the year was 158, resulting in 345 cases, of which 13 were horses taken for use during the winter months, 95 were received at the hospital stable, and the others were attended at the houses where they were assigned.

RANK AND FILE.

The year has been marked by a larger number of stubborn fires than usual, and has therefore given generous opportunity to test the mettle of both officers and men. The Commissioners have found renewed cause, in the experiences of these thirteen months, to feel pride and confidence in the loyalty, zeal, and efficiency of the department, and desire to cordially thank those who have so faithfully carried out their wishes and commands.

THE POLICE DEPARTMENT.

The same summons that calls the firemen to frequent and protracted effort also brings out the police to sustain an important part; and this department acknowledges its indebtedness to them on many warm occasions for prompt and efficient service. On them largely depends the duty of clearing the way for action, and their work along this line has been very satisfactory.

THE PROTECTIVE ALLY.

The protective service has maintained its acknowledged excellence, and with the additions that have been made to the working force, and the contemplated enlargement of the department by a new station on Appleton street, its good work can be largely extended.

THE FIRE MARSHAL.

The class of crimes with which this official has to deal is one very difficult to prove to the satisfaction of the law; but in several important instances the past year these difficulties have been overcome, thus proving the sagacity and diligence of the head of the office, and showing its machinery to be in good working order.

THE BOARD OF FIRE COMMISSIONERS

consists of three members. One member is appointed annually, for a term of three years, from the first Monday in May each year. The nomination is made by the Mayor, subject to confirmation by the Board of Aldermen.

FIRE DISTRICTS.

The city is divided into ten fire districts, as follows:

- DISTRICT 1. Comprises all that part of Boston known as East Boston.
- DISTRICT 2. All that part of Boston formerly known as Charlestown.
- DISTRICT 3. All that part east of a line beginning at the Charles-river drawbridge, and running through the centre of Charlestown street, Haymarket square, and Washington to Summer street, and north of Summer street and the N.Y. and N.E. R.R. passenger depot to the water.
- DISTRICT 4. All that part west of District 3, and north of a line running through the centre of Winter and Park streets, and west of Beacon, to Arlington street, west side of Commonwealth avenue, to Chester park, to water.
- DISTRICT 5. All that part south of Districts 3 and 4 to the centre of Dover-street drawbridge, and a line running through the centre of Dover, Berkeley, Boylston, east side of Commonwealth avenue, to Arlington, to Boylston street.
- DISTRICT 6. All that part of Boston known as South Boston.
- DISTRICT 7. All that part of Boston south of District 5, to the centre of Albany street; thence through the centre of Albany and Northampton streets, Columbus avenue and Chester park, to east side of Commonwealth avenue, to centre of Berkeley, to Dover street.
- DISTRICT 8. All that part south and west of District 7, to the boundary line of West Roxbury, and west of Washington street to the Brookline boundary line, and including all of Ward 25, formerly Brighton.

- DISTRICT 9. All that part south of Districts 6 and 7, to West Roxbury line, running through the centre of Blue Hill avenue, Columbia, Green, Bowdoin, Church, and Commercial streets, to Dorchester avenue, thence due east to the water.
- DISTRICT 10. All the southerly part of Boston south o. Districts 8 and 9, including West Roxburyf

WATER AND HYDRANTS.

The total number of hydrants in the city February 1 was 5,932. In addition to these hydrants there are 238 fire reservoirs in different sections of the city that contain from 300 to 500 hogsheads of water, and can be used in an emergency. The number of hydrants added during the year is as follows: 47 Lowry, 206 Post, 1 Boston, and 82 Boston Lowry.

In all cases the Water Board have cheerfully complied with the requests of this board in the establishment of hydrants, whenever necessity required.
