HYDRANTS. — For supplying water in cases of fire, 5,932, viz.: in the city proper, 1,454; in South Boston, 579; in East Boston, 373; in Roxbury, 977; in Dorchester, 1,130; in West Roxbury, 697; in Brighton, 412; in Charlestown, 289; and 21 on Deer Island. The hydrants are located at an average distance of 250 feet from each other.

BOSTON FIREMEN'S RELIEF FUND.

By Chapter 107 of the Acts of 1880, the Mayor of the City of Boston for the time being (and his successors in office), the Board of Fire Commissioners of the City of Boston for the time being (and their successors in office), were constituted a body corporate for the purpose of receiving and holding all sums of money, and real and personal estate, not exceeding in the aggregate two

hundred thousand dollars, which may be given, granted, bequeathed, or devised to it for the benefit of members of the Boston Fire Department, or their families, requiring assistance, or for the benefit of any persons, or the families of any persons, who have been such members, requiring assistance. The property so held shall be known as the Boston Firemen's Relief Fund. The raid body corporate shall have authority to manage and dispose of the same and the income thereof according to their best discretion, subject to the pro-

and the income thereof according to their best discretion, subject to the provisions of any and all trusts which may be created for the purposes aforesaid. In accordance with the provisions of the foregoing act, the following-named persons, viz.: The Mayor, Nathan Matthews, Jr.; Fire Commissioners Robert G. Fitch, John R. Murphy, and George H. Innis, — now constitute the Board of Trustees. Nathan Matthews, Jr., Mayor, President; John R. Murphy, Treasurer; Frederick W. Smith, Jr., Clerk.
