VI. HIGH COMMENDATION

On August 20, 1986, at 2218 hours, members of Ladder Company 24 observed from quarters a young male running erratically down the center of Cambridge Street in heavy traffic and being pursued by two other males. The pursuers alerted the members of Ladder Company 24 that the person fleeing had assaulted two women. F.F.O.P. Frank Rogier, Ladder Company 24, gave immediate chase on foot and was joined by Fire Captain James Evans, Engine Company 4, and Aide to District 3, Fire Fighter Edward Finch, who were in contact with Fire Alarm via portable radio. The above members succeeded in subduing the man after a difficult chase through heavy traffic. The person was in an extremely crazed state and it took great effort and great personal risk to restrain him until the arrival of police. The Fire Alarm Office dispatched Engine Company 4 and Ladder Company 24 to assist.

The Fire Commissioner is pleased to highly commend Fire Captain James Evans, Engine Company 4, F.F.O.P. FIRE PREVENTION WEEK

Fire Prevention Week will be observed in the City of Boston from October 5 to October 11, 1986, inclusive.

During Fire Prevention Week, company officers and all members shall review the Smoke Detector Laws so that people visiting the fire houses can get the correct answers to Smoke Detector Laws.

Fire stations shall be open to the public between the hours of 1200 and 2000 hours for inspection of the premises and for the conveyance of information concerning the fire department functions and fire prevention matters. When citizens come to a station during Fire Prevention Week, the man on house patrol shall summon the commanding officer who should be available and ready to either show the visitors around the station and to answer the questions regarding the department, or to have a suitable person assigned to this duty.

The officer in charge of quarters shall see that the Fire Prevention Week plywood sign issued to all stations is displayed during this week. It is the responsibility of company officers to see to it that these signs are kept in good condition from year to year. Signs should be displayed from Sunday to Saturday. Signs shall be checked daily by the officer in charge of quarters to assure that they are firmly affixed to the building in a proper manner.

District Fire Chiefs are directed to take an active interest in Fire Prevention Programs in the following manner:

By making arrangements with the various plants and industrial enterprises within the district to hold fire drills during the week, by grading these drills as good, fair, or poor and making a report of same to the Fire Prevention Division, indicating the name of the enterprise, the date of the drill and the grade. Same should be forwarded promptly. Each concern should be requested to acknowledge participation in Fire Prevention Week activities via written correspondence. These drills should be conducted by a company officer after arrangements are made. At plants where there are special or company fire brigades, particular attention should be given to assignments and/or response procedures. It is requested that the name of the company officer conducting the drill be furnished. It is anticipated that not less than three drills be conducted in each district.

Company officers will contact school officials in the schools in their sub-district and make arrangements to hold the required fire exit drills during Fire Prevention Week, if feasible. The fire exit drill shall be so arranged that it will be held prior to the end of the school day.

The District Fire Chief should compile a list of fraternal, social, civic and professional organizations within the district and advertise to them the willingness of the fire department to provide company officers for the purpose of lecturing on fire prevention at any time. District Fire Chiefs should make a concerted effort to bring the activities of the department before these organizations and arrange for lectures to be given. The name of any organization so participating should be reported to the Fire Prevention Division, specifically if the organization can be urged to forward on their own stationery a notation of the event, it would be to the greater advantage of the fire department.

Fire fighters are to pay special attention to the observance of fire hazards and to the duty of observing and locating fire hazards along the route followed by them in their coming to and going from daily work. Dilapidated buildings, rubbish accumulation and other hazards should be reported in accordance with abatement procedure as outlined in S.O.P. 25. The public expects uniformed members of the fire department to know something about fire prevention work and to have an interest in this subject since they are public employees engaged in this field. Fire fighters, therefore, during Fire Prevention Week, should have this subject uppermost in their minds and they should not pass a fire hazard at any time without making a note of it for reference to the Fire Prevention Division. In short, every uniformed man in the fire department is a fire prevention inspector at all times.

Company commanders, on receipt of the Fire Prevention posters, will post these items in a suitable location at the front of each fire station where they will be visible to the public. They will remain posted until October 11, 1986.

IX. HIGH COMMENDATION

His brother stated that he had already slashed both his arms and thighs with a knife. He had stabbed his brother in a previous incident and was extremely violent.

The members of Engine Company 50 immediately entered the apartment, found the victim on his feet bleeding from both arms and thighs and wielding a six inch knife. On approach, the victim made threatening gestures, forcing the members of Engine Company 50 to leave the building.

HIGH COMMENDATION CONTINUED

Fire Fighter William J. Boyle, Jr, Engine Company 50, entered the apartment. He made his way as close as possible to the victim and commenced talking to him in a confiding manner while being threatened with the knife repeatedly, as the man continued to stab himself. Fire Fighter Boyle remained in the apartment for approximately 40 minutes, talking to and gaining the confidence of this deranged individual. The victim finally surrendered the weapon, due to the persuasiveness and determined efforts of Fire Fighter Boyle.

Fire Fighter William J. Boyle showed complete disregard for his own personal safety, while exposed to extreme personal risk in performing this life saving act.

The Fire Commissioner is pleased to highly commend Fire Fighter William J. Boyle, Jr., Engine Company 50, and recommends that his case be referred to the Board of Merit for further consideration.

II. HIGH COMMENDATIONS

On November 12, 1986, at 0345 hours, Engine Company 7 responded to a Still Alarm, AFA Signal, for an alarm of fire at 78 Charles Street South, the Milner Hotel.

Upon arrival, heavy fire and smoke were reported from the fourth floor rear.

Engine Company 7 advanced a 2 1/2" line via the interior front stairwell to the fourth floor where the members encountered heavy fire.

Before the line was charged, Fire Fighter Robert M. Linnell of Engine Company 7 heard screams from an upper floor. He proceeded to the fifth floor which was heavily charged with smoke. Fire was also extending up from the fourth floor via an outer court and a light shaft.

Fire Fighter Linnell made his way down the fifth floor hallway directly above the heavy fire and entered a room where he believed the cry originated. After crawling to a window, he observed a woman holding a year old child in one arm and an infant in the other at the edge of a roof. This woman had jumped from the roof of the fire building to an adjacent roof at 74 Warrenton Street. The woman had walked the ridge pole and apparently slipped or panicked and slid down the roof which had a 50 degree pitch.

HIGH COMMENDATIONS CONTINUED

Fire Fighter Linnell immediately removed his air mask and leaped out of the window which was in line with the edge of the pitched roof. He landed on his stomach and crawled across the roof some twenty feet until he reached the distraught woman and children. The woman had stopped her fall when her feet hit the gutter. Fire Fighter Linnell managed to hold each of the children and calm the woman who, in the opinion of fire, police officers and by-standers, was intent in jumping until the arrival of Ladder Company 15 who removed them to safety.

Because Fire Fighter Robert M. Linnell of Engine Company 7, by his quick action and at extreme personal risk to his own life, saved the lives of the woman and two children, the Fire Commissioner is pleased to highly commend him and refers his case to the Board of Merit for further consideration.

On November 12, 1986, at 0345 hours, Ladder Company 17 responded to a Still Alarm, AFA Signal, for an alarm of fire at 78 Charles Street South, the Milner Hotel.

Upon arrival, Ladder Company 17 noted heavy smoke showing from the upper floors. Box 1512 was transmitted. Three alarms were eventually struck to control the fire and life hazard.

While ladders were being raised, Fire Fighter Reynolds A. Shepherd, Ladder Company 17, was ordered to the fourth floor where heavy fire and smoke were encountered from rooms to the left of a long corridor. Fire Fighter Shepherd heard screaming from the end of this corridor. He made his way down this hallway, past the fire in rooms to his left. Near the end of this passageway, he found a woman and two infants. They were in a desperate state. He carried the two children and led the woman back down the corridor, past the fire, to safety via the stairway to the street.

Because Fire Fighter Reynolds A. Shepherd, Ladder Company 17, performed these rescues at great personal risk and under extremely difficult conditions, before effective ventilation had been performed and while lines of hose were being run, the Fire Commissioner is pleased to highly commend him and refers his case to the Board of Merit for further consideration.

III. COMMENDATION

Acting Deputy Fire Chief John A. Lockhead, all uniformed personnel and the fire alarm operating force, who participated in operations at Box 13-1283 (6 alarms) on December 9, 1986, are commended for extraordinary performance of duty under extremely difficult conditions.

COMMENDATION CONTINUED

Special notice is made of Fire Lieutenant Francis L. McLaughlin, Engine Company 42, and Fire Fighter David C. Johnson, Engine Company 50, who voluntarily climbed up a blind elevator shaft approximately 50 feet above the basement and entered through the top of the elevator to reach two female occupants. They then hoisted up manual tools, opened the elevators doors, broke through the wall into the corridor and assisted the women to safety.
