REPAIRS ON ENGINE HOUSE.

By amount of appropriation, \$200 00 SELECTMEN'S REPORT. FIRE DEPARTMENT. The appropriation for the Fire Department was \$6,400; the amount of orders drawn, \$6,054.37; of this amount, \$1,203.49 was drawn to pay bills incurred previous to Jan. 15, 1875, making the actual expense of the Department for the current year less than \$5,000. It has been the constant aim of the Engineers, we are pleased to say, to avoid all unnecessary expenditures, and no considerable outlay has been made by them without consulting the Selectmen. We are assured that the best of feeling prevails among the members of the Department, and for its discipline and efficiency the town is to be congratulated. As will be noticed in the report of the Engineers, they recommend that some action be taken in regard to further water supply. It appears to be an actual necessity that additional reservoirs should be constructed,
