Although we have been severely criticised at times by our fellow-citizens for some slight mistakes, yet we look back upon our year's record with pride, feeling that we have not only been a credit, but a great benefit to our town, and have merited the respect and hearty support of our fellow-citizens. At our annual town meeting one thousand dollars was appropriated for the much needed repairs on our Engine house. Although that amount proved insufficient, the work has been carried through and the house put in thorough repairs, and will need but little outlay for years to come. At the commencement of the year our faithful steward, Joshua Wilder, requested that, on account of the increasing duties, he might be relieved, and some one appointed to fill his place. The Board after much consideration, appointed Mr. Edward A. Hawley, who has faithfully and honorably discharged the responsible duties attending that office, to the entire satisfaction of the Board of Engineers. To our fire alarm system which we consider a valuable acquisition, has been added a tower striker, located in the tower of the Methodist Church, four street boxes located as follows: At Mattapan Mills, near American Tool and Machine Co., at Hair Factory, and at Cotton Mill, and five house tappers at the houses of the firemen, which have been paid for by the men. About two miles of wire have been run with all necessary machinery to complete the same. A hose house has been built by vote of the town, located on the corner of Metropolitan avenue and
