

All its members try to do their duty. They respond promptly to alarms and get to the fire as quickly as possible under some difficulties. Much better

time could be made if there were two pairs of horses and two permanent men in the Central Station, and in our opinion it is time such addition was made to the department facilities. If such a condition can be reached, the entire department need not respond on first alarms; having horses in readiness, they can hitch and wait 20 minutes, and if not

In case of an alarm from that district it is a long At present we depend upon horses from an outside stable. Very often the horses we get are just put up after a long drive or a hard day's work, and it is not to be expected that they can take the apparatus to a fire as quickly as a good fresh pair waiting in the Station for just such work.
