**FIREMAN MITCHELL
DIES OF INJURIES**

Alexander F. Mitchell of Engine 1, South Boston, who was injured early Tuesday morning while responding to an alarm from box 722, C st and Broadway, South Boston died at the City Hospital late yesterday as the result of wounds sustained when Engine 1 collided with Ladder 20 at the corner of C and Silver sts

The engine was hurrying to a fire in an unoccupied wooden dwelling when the accident happened. Four firemen, among them hoseman Mitchell, were thrown off the wagon, which crashed into an electric light pole, went through a plate glass window and tipped over.

The four men taken to the hospital were hosemen Mitchell, Quirk, Barry and Sullivan. The others are expected to recover.

Hoseman Mitchell was a South Boston boy, popular among his friends (and he had many), and was the life of the company at the house of Engine 1, Dorchester st. His young wife was prostrated by the blow of his death.

Mr Mitchell was married six years ago. Besides his wife he is survived by his father, Alexander C. Mitchell; his brother, John Mitchell, and two sisters, Margaret Mitchell and Mrs. Julia Spinney. Mr Mitchell was born in South Boston and graduated from the old Bigelow School. He had been in the department eight years, the first six months with Engine 3, East Boston. He was treasurer of the Firemen's Relief Association.

He was a member of the sanctuary choir of St. Vincent's Church of South Boston and assisted in the work on the altar.
