NO DETAIL OF FIREMEN NAMED

**None Wanted by Chief
Mullen's Family.**

**Men in Service Attending Will
Do So Voluntarily.**

**Fire Chiefs' Club Is to
Attend in Body.**

Ex-Chief John A. Mullen will not have a fireman's funeral. Whatever firemen attend the services at the home, 87 Wellington Hill st, Mattapan, tomorrow morning, will be there voluntarily, as no order has been issued from headquarters concerning the funeral. For causes best known to themselves, Chief Mullen's family decided to have no escort of firemen at the funeral.

The Fire Chiefs' Club of Massachusetts, of which Chief Mullen was president, will attend the funeral in a body, having postponed the annual outing, which was scheduled for tomorrow.

A detail of 30 men has been provided for the funeral of Junior Deputy Chief Pope, which also will be held tomorrow morning at 9 at St Joseph's Church in Roxbury. It has not been decided whether Chief McDonough or Acting Deputy Chief Sennott will be in charge of the detail.

Four district chiefs and four captains, to be named later, will be the bearers. Deputy Pope lived at 53 Warren st, Roxbury, and the cortege will leave there at 8:45. The men who have been detailed to the funeral will assemble at Ladder 4 house at 8:30.
