





THE PATRICK J. KENNEDY MEDAL OF HONOR

Established as a gift of the Honorable Joseph P. Kennedy in the memory of his father Patrick J. Kennedy who served as Fire Commissioner of the City of Boston in 1905. It is to be awarded to the Firefighter who, in the opinion of the Fire Commissioner and the Board of Merit, has performed an act of outstanding heroism in connection with his duties as a member of the Boston Fire Department.

Clements be awarded the Patrick J. Kennedy Medal of Honor."
