

WALTER SCOTT MEDAL

Firefighter Robert P. Foley of Engine Co. 43

A still alarm was received at 6:18 A.M. followed by an alarm from Box 7236 at 6:19 A.M. on Sunday, December 25th, 1955. When the apparatus arrived at the scene, the members encountered a fire, extending from the first floor to the upper stories of a 21/2 story, frame dwelling house at 28 Middle St., South Boston.

Firefighters Francis A. Cady of Ladder Co. 20 and Robert P. Foley of Engine Co. 43 entered the building with a booster line in advance of a 21/2 in, line from Engine 43. While operating on the fire, they learned that a young boy was sleeping in an attic bedroom. They passed the booster line to another member, donned gas masks, and started up the stairs. Inasmuch as ventilation had not been completed, the pres-

ence of smoke was extremely heavy and the excessive heat started to burn the exposed parts of their hands, necks, and ears. With firm determination, they continued to make their

way up the stairs to the attic. They searched the two rooms and found the unconscious body of a young boy in a bed. They removed him from the bed, carried him out of the room and down the stairs to the street. He was removed to the Boston City Hospital in a Police Ambulance.

Firefighter Foley was highly commended by the Fire Commissioner in General Orders No. 4, series of 1956. for his heroism. Because of his heroic action, under very trying conditions. and the extreme personal risk under-


taken, the Board of Merit recommends that Firefighter Robert P. Foley, be awarded the "Walter Scott Medal for Valor".


PATRICK J. KENNEDY MEDAL

While operating on the fire, they learned that a young boy was sleeping in an attic bedroom. They passed the booster line to another member, donned gas masks, and started up the stairs. He was removed to the Boston City Hospital in a Police Ambulance, Firefighter Cady suffered a painful injury to his right ankle when he slipped on the stairs during rescue operation which required his going on injured leave.

Firefighter Cady was highly commended by the Fire Commissioner in General Order No. 4, series of 1956, for his heroism. Because of his heroic action, under very trying conditions, and the extreme personal risk undertaken, the Board of Merit recommends that Firefighter Francis A. Cady be awarded the "Patrick J. Kennedy Medal of

ROLL OF MERIT

Firefighter WILLIAM E. PERO of Ladder Co. 3

The apparatus responded to an alarm from Box 2217 at 5:34 P.M., on December 24, 1955, followed by a second alarm at 5:41 P.M. Upon arrival, it was found that a three family wooden dwelling house at 5 Comet Place, South End, was involved in fire. Smoke and fire were issuing from the first floor windows and doorway. People on the street were shouting that a man was trapped in the first floor.

Firefighter William E, Pero of Ladder Co. 3, who was off duty at the time, and was in quarters when the alarm sounded, responded with Engine 3. He immediately went to the rear of the building and entered through a first floor window. The heat was unbearable and the room heavily charged with smoke and gases. Firefighter Pero groped his way about the room and came upon the unconscious form of a man on the floor. He lifted and dragged him across the floor to the window where he was assisted by another member in removing him to the street. Members of Ladder Co. 12 operated their resuscitator on the victim and he was removed to the Boston City Hospital in a Police Ambulance. Firefighter Pero effected this rescue without the benefit of a gas mask.

Firefighter Pero was highly commended by the Fire Commissioner in General Orders No. 4, series of 1956, for his courageous action which undoubtedly saved the victim's life. Because of his quick and determined action, and the great personal risk involved, the Board of Merit recommends that the name of Firefighter William E. Pero be placed on the "Roll of Merit".

ROLL OF MERIT

Firefighter WARREN F. HALL of Engine Co. 28

An alarm was received from Box 2517 at twelve minutes after 1:00 A.M. on the morning of December 4, 1955. Engine 28, Engine Squad 53, Ladder Cos. 10, 30 and the District Fire Chief responded and found a two family dwelling house at 5-7 St. Rose Street, Jamaica Plain, involved in fire.

Members of the Department were informed by people in the street that a woman was trapped on the second floor. Immediately, Firefighter Warren F. Hall of Engine Co. 28 entered the building, in advance of the line, ascended the stairs to the second floor and made his way to a bedroom in the front of the building. This room was afire; nevertheless, Firefighter Hall, in spite of intense heat and smoke, made his way into the room. He found an unconscious woman on the floor, lifted and carried her out of the room, along the hallway to the head of the stairs, where he was assisted by members of Ladder Co. 10 in removing her to the street. The members of Engine Squad 53 gave the victim first aid. She was removed to the Boston City Hospital in a Police Ambulance. Prior to the arrival of the apparatus, a passerby attempted to enter the building and rescue the victim but was overcome by the intense heat and inhalation of smoke. He was given first aid by members of Engine Squad 53 and removed in a Police Ambulance to the Boston City Hospital.

Firefighter Hall was highly commended in General Orders No. 65, series of 1955, for his courageous action under adverse conditions. Because of his prompt action, with a total disregard for his own safety, the Board of Merit recommends that the name of Firefighter Warren F. Hall be placed on the "Roll of Merit".

PURPOSE OF THE ORGANIZATION

The Boston Firemen's Relief Fund was organized in 1879 and incorporated under the statutes of Massachusetts in 1909 and is now completing seventy-seven years of successful operation.

Every man appointed permanently to the department automatically is eligible for assistance from the Boston Firemen's Relief Fund from the day he is appointed.

The proceeds from this ball are used to pay doctors' bills and hospitalization of members injured in the performance of their duty, also to assist dependents of deceased firefighters.
