Assistant Engineer John W. Regan, in addition to the duties which he now performs, is hereby made "Inspector of Hose and Harness."

He shall visit from time to time the houses of the department, examine the condition of the hose and harness therein, see that the same is kept in proper condition, give suitable directions as to its care, and report any carelessness on the part of the members of the department in the use of the same.

He shall, when he deems it necessary, or when ordered by the Board, test the hose, and shall, on the first Monday in each month, report to the Board the condition of the hose and harness which he has examined during the previous month, with such recommendations as he may deem expedient.

He shall have general charge of the Hose and Harness shop and the repairs therein done, and shall visit the same at least three times a week, and shall see that the rules governing it are observed.

Fabric hose when wet or damp will in no case be allowed to remain on the reel or wagon longer than 24 hours. Hose that has been on the reel or wagon for ten days without being used must be changed and the fact noted on the Company Journal. In freezing weather after a fire the greatest care must be taken of fabric hose which has become frozen.

All rules and orders inconsistent with this order are hereby repealed.

An Order in Relation to Permanent Substitutes.

1. Permanent substitutes shall be uniformed similarly to the members of the permanent force, shall be governed by the same rules and regulations, and will be entitled to the same privileges as to leaves of absence and days off, except vacations.

2. Each permanent substitute, when appointed, will be assigned for extra duty to some permanent company in the Department, and will be detailed by the Board to serve in other companies during the absence of any of its permanent members, or when a vacancy occurs. At the expiration of his detail the substitute shall return to the company to which he was originally assigned.

3. The foremen of companies to which substitutes are assigned or detailed will see that they are properly instructed in their duties as firemen, and, on the first Monday in each month, will report to the Board their conduct and capacity, both in the house and at fires.

4. All applicants for position on the permanant force must serve as substitutes before being appointed to said force.

5. The pay of permanent substitutes will be at the rate of \$720.00 per annum, and shall be in full of all services rendered, and payable on a roll to be known as the Permanent Substitute Roll.

6. Unless otherwise ordered the number of permanent substitutes shall not exceed twelve, providing, however, that this limit shall not apply to those already appointed.

7. All rules and orders inconsistent with this order are hereby repealed, but all others shall still remain in force.

8. This order shall take effect on the 21st of July current.
