6. Case of Troy T. Osgood, Engine Company 41

On September 14, 1999, while off duty, he discovered a man lying on the sidewalk at the Copley Square Library. He conducted a primary survey and found the man had stopped breathing. After obtaining a CPR microshield and medical gloves from nearby MBTA personnel, he performed a mouth sweep for obstructions followed by rescue breaths. Further survey found the patient was pulseless so chest compressions were performed. He continued CPR until relieved by on duty Fire and EMS personnel.

Because of his dedicated actions, the Fire Commissioner highly commended Fire Fighter Troy T. Osgood of Engine Company 41 in General Order No. 30 of 1999.

The Board recommends that Fire Fighter Troy T. Osgood of Engine Company 41 be awarded the Distinguished Service Award.
