

BOWDOIN SQUARE FIREHOUSE 1930-1962

Internationally known as "The Big House".

PROLOGUE:

The old Bowdoin Square firehouse was in existence from November 1930 thru October 1963; and during the period February 15, 1946 and February 4, 1947; it became Internationally known as the "Big House" for in all the World, there was no equal in manpower and fire companies. Manning Engines 4, 6 and 10; Ladders 1 and 24; Rescue 3 and District Chief 4; were 14 Company Officers; 80 Firefighters, and two Chief Officers; each working 84-hours a week.

As result of a campaign lead by Local 718, Boston voters reduced the work-week to 48-hours, effective February 4th, 1947. The current 42-hours a week became effective June 29, 1971.

Engine 6 was deactivated February 4th, 1947; reactivated April 27, 1949; and again deactivated July 13, 1954. Ladder 1 relocated to Hanover street on September 22, 1948. Engine 10 left for the new house on River Street, Beacon Hill, on April 14, 1949; and Rescue (minus the "3") was relocated to Fort Hill Square on June 11, 1960. Engine 4 and Ladder 24 left Bowdoin Square on October 28, 1963.

A "break-up Party was held on the main floor of the "Big House" on May 26th, 1962; and in November 1963, the firehouse of World reknown, was demolished, and replaced by today's "Saltonstall Building."

A RECORD TO BE PROUD OF:

Available records reveal that 280 men served time in the "Big House"; 1945 thru 1962; and were an intricate part of the Boston Fire Department. Taking nothing from other Firefighters; the "Big House" gang was "unique"; having fought on first alarm basis; every conceivable type of fire encountered by an urban department.

Indocrinated by their respected predecessors, the 1945-1962 group well-served the BFD and Boston's citizenry; as their firefighting experience extended to ALL Fire Districts via transfers and promotions.

The experienced men of FIREFIGHTER rank; were supplemented by <u>SEVENTY</u> (25%) of that group who became FIRE OFFICERS: 24 Lieutenants; 16 Captains; one Supt. of Maintenance; 22 District Chiefs and 7 Deputy Chiefs.

of the 280 men named, SIX men died in Line of Duty; many were permanently injured; and TWENTY-FOUR were officially honored by the BFD for heroics above and beyond regular fire duty.

It is of vital importance to note here, that when Boston Firefighters local 718 was Chartered on April 17, 1942; TWELVE (12)men of the sixteen (16) signing the Charter, were at that time, assigned to fire companies in the "Big House". Their foresight 44 years ago; inspired HUNDREDS of men over the years, to join Local 718 in working for and gaining the MANY benefits enjoyed today, by active and retired BFD men; their widows and families.

The above clearly indicates that the men who served in the Bowdoin Square firehouse during 1945 thru 1962, have in firefighting and in Unionism; A RECORD TO BE PROUD OF.
